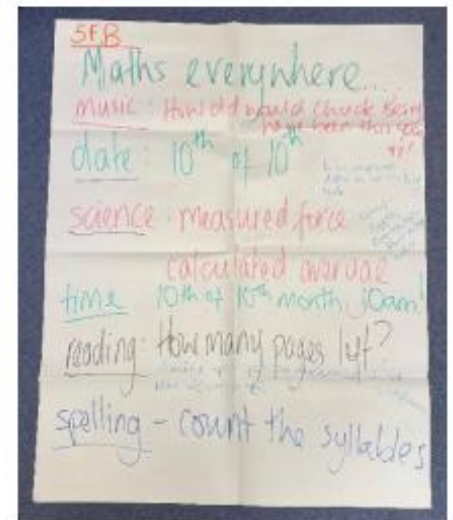
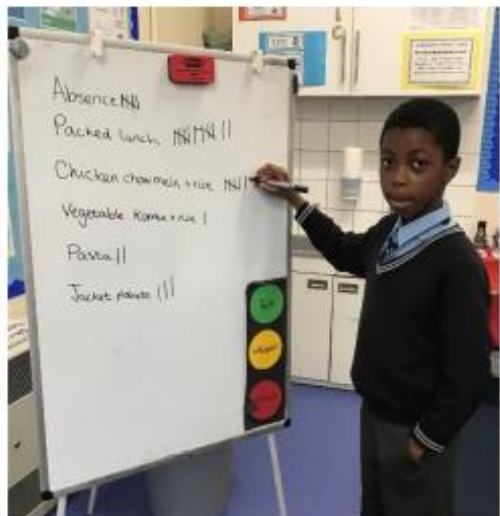
Maths Across the Curriculum

Teachers throughout the school have been highlighting the use of maths in non-maths lessons, reminding the children that they use maths much more than they think! The **Ladybirds** and **Bumblebees** always have games that include some element of maths in them through their continuous provision, including counting, shape and grouping.

Some other highlights include **Year 1** introducing algorithms to guide a partner, then a Beebot, around a numbered grid, before going back a hundred years for some number chanting on the Victorian Day. **Year 3** always capture their lunch choices using a tally or bar chart and have started trying to spot patterns. They also used measurement, prediction, estimation and tabulation to carry out a scientific experiment involving grabbing cubes.

In **Year 5** the children kept a table of every time they came across maths in another subject, including the likes of time, ordinal numbers, the four operations and shapes. **Year 6** used time, estimation, prediction, ordering and means when carrying out a bird beak evolution experiment. They also discussed negative numbers, mass and distance when exploring Antarctica in geography lessons.

The children are now much more adept at spotting contextual maths and we will continue to highlight maths in other lessons throughout the year.
