

Pupil Premium 2018-19

Our Pupil Premium Funding for the current financial year is based on 421 children (January Census)

- 10.9% of pupils in the school are receiving Free School Meals (46 children).
- 0% of pupils in the school are looked after.
- 8.55% of pupils in the school have received free school meals in one or more of the previous 6 years (Ever 6) (36 children).
- 0.47 % of pupils in the school are from Service Families (2 children).

It has been estimated that we will receive £113, 440 Pupil Premium funding on 82 children (46 FSM + 36 Ever 6).

Schools, headteachers and teachers will decide how to use the Pupil Premium allocation, as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for individual pupils. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools per FSM pupil, is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. The Senior Leadership Team have discussed at length how the pupil Premium funding can best be used to have maximum impact and benefit.

A range of activities and interventions have and will be funded by the pupil premium, to support pupil progress and attainment. Additional strategies and interventions are in place to support the progress and attainment of all vulnerable groups and individuals. Such interventions include school trip subsidy, enrichment opportunities, EAL TA and speech and language TA provision, provision of school uniform and equipment etc. that are funded from other funding streams.

Staff training	£2,000	Staff have knowledge, skills and expertise to best support target children.
Accelerated Reader	£1,000	Pupils have access to a rich variety of reading material and are motivated to read widely. Gaps between disadvantaged and all children is closed and attainment and progress targets are met.
Speech therapist and Speech and Language TAs	£9,000	Gaps between disadvantaged and all children is closed. Identified children meet attainment and progress targets.
Resources	£500	Specific resources for interventions to raise attainment for identified children.
Breakfast Club + Master classes	£500	Target children have a positive start to the day and are ready to learn.
Family Support Worker	£10,000	Early intervention is in place, supporting families to engage with the school and support their child's learning.
Benefit led FSM (not Gov funded EYFS/KS1)	£10,450	Based on 25 children.
Enrichment	£1,110	All children experience St Matthew's 11 by 11 opportunities.
