<p>Communication</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Key vocabulary and sentence stems support communication and emotional literacy. • Topical clips from programmes such as <i>Newsround</i> are used to prompt discussion about issues. • PSHE plans are flexible allowing for responsive teaching to school incidents or issues in the news. 		
<p>Aspiration</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teaching focuses on personal safety, emotional development, health and wellbeing - prerequisites for aspiration. • Visitors and community links enrich pupils' experiences. eg. BBC presenter, Ambulance & Fire Services <i>World of Work</i> • Units of work such as 'Dreams and Goals' promote self-belief, confidence and ambition. 		
<p>Creativity</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scrapbooks provide evidence of a creative approach, including drama, role play, art and the use of digital media. • PSHE planning is flexible and responsive. • Provision often incorporates visits / workshops, such as <i>Expect Respect</i>, <i>Crucial Crew</i> and <i>Suffolk One Life</i> sessions. 		
<p>Knowledge of the World</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pupils are encouraged to get to know themselves and reflect upon their own thoughts, feelings and actions. • Pupils learn about important issues relating to modern life, including online safety, peer pressure and mental health. • Pupils are taught how to seek help to address any worries or issues that may concern them.
